Ecosystems of Well-being: Family, Environments, and Public Policies in Violence Prevention

The School of Psychology at Gabriela Mistral University invites academics, researchers, and professionals to participate in the **5th version of the International Psychology Congress UGM 2026**.

Under the theme **"Ecosystems of Well-being: Family, Environments, and Public Policies in Violence Prevention"**, this year's gathering seeks to deepen the understanding of constructing spaces that ensure comprehensive well-being across the lifespan. The congress proposes an interdisciplinary approach to resilience and violence prevention within its various spheres of manifestation: familial, educational, workplace, and social settings.

Thematic Axes

● Well-being across the Lifespan and Strengthening of Family Bonds

This axis focuses on the study of the psychological and relational factors that promote healthy development from childhood to adulthood. It seeks to analyze the role of the family as the primary protective environment capable of mitigating risks and fostering resilience in the face of adverse contexts.

Research will be received in the following lines:

- Promotion of socio-emotional well-being and emotional regulation strategies in children and adolescents.
- Strengthening of parenting skills and non-violent child-rearing practices.
- Resilience factors in students exposed to vulnerable environments and their impact on academic performance.
- Prevention and approach to violence in dating relationships and non-formal affective relationships.

● Healthy Digital Culture and Safety in Digitally Mediated Environments

This axis analyzes the impact of technology on socialization and learning processes, addressing the challenges that the "digital revolution" imposes on mental health. Priority is given to studies proposing strategies to guarantee safe, free of violence and ethical digital digital citizenship.

Research will be received in the following lines:

- Digital literacy strategies for the prevention of cyberbullying and grooming.
- The role of Artificial Intelligence in content moderation and the prevention of hate speech.
- Impact of early access to mobile devices on executive functions and mental health (anxiety, depression, etc.).
- Parental digital mediation and "holding mentality" regarding indiscriminate internet use.
- Protection of personal data and digital rights of children and adolescents in educational environments.
- Healthy digital strategies for skill development in educational contexts.



● **Intervention Strategies and Public Policies for Strengthening Well-being and Violence Prevention**

This axis addresses the macro dimension of intervention, analyzing the effectiveness of public policies and legal frameworks in the construction of violence-free spaces. It focuses on professional management and institutional leadership to ensure safe environments.

Research will be received in the following lines:

- Impact evaluation of socio-emotional education programs and school climate protocols.
- Implementation and effectiveness of prevention and response protocols regarding gender-based violence in educational institutions.
- Analysis of child and adolescent protection laws (e.g., positive work climate and mental health in clinical fields, mental health in higher education, national and international laws and protocols, etc.).
- Management of community relationships in work environments and prevention of teacher stress or burnout.
- Mediation and peaceful conflict resolution in educational and social communities.

Participation Modalities

- ✓ **Oral Presentation:** Individual or group presentations lasting 15 to 20 minutes, based on research, experiences, or theoretical reviews regarding the thematic axes of the congress.
- ✓ **Academic Posters:** Visual presentations of ongoing or concluded research, allowing for the exhibition of findings in an accessible and interactive manner. Selected posters will be exhibited in a special virtual session.
